
# Hazard Incidents in Bangladesh, January 2018



### Overview of Hazard Incidents in January 2018

In January 2018, four major hazard incidents occurred among which 2 were man-made (fire and boat/ trawler capsize) and 2 were natural (earthquake and cold wave throughout the month). Incidents in January were at its pick in number and most of these were in small in scale.

Although frequency of hazards are quite low in number, but intensity of those are quite noteworthy. 22 fire incidents took over 5 lives of people with several property loss. Cold wave throughout the month caused serious disruption to livelihood and distress to the affected people. Sometimes minimum temperature goes below 10°C, minimum temperature was recorded 2.6 degree Celsius. These had unadorned difficulties to human life all over the country. Government assistance were required to recovery from these worse situations.

## <u>Fire</u>

In January, 22 fire incidents are reported in 9 districts which caused death of 5 people, 10 got injured and severe property losses of BDT 69.5 lakh. Overall scenario is given below:

In January, two boat capsize were reported – one in Narayanganj and another in Jhalakathi which causes missing of 3 people.


#### **Cold Wave**

Continuing from last few years, the country had experienced some severe to moderate cold waves this year too that caused serious disruption to livelihood and distress to the affected people. Lowest temperature was 2.6°C was in Panchagarh. 2 person died in Rangpur, 1 person died and 5 other injured in Kurigram and 1 women died in Lalmonirhat Due to cold wave when they were heating up by fire.

In January 2018 northern and southwest parts of the country experienced severe to moderate cold waves with a rapid fall in temperature with cold winds and dense fog resulting significant rise in respiratory

illnesses, and in some cases deaths, while in January 2018 the Meteorological Department recorded the temperature as 2 to 5 degrees Celsius lower than the normal average temperature (about 10°C) during that time of the previous year.

According to the Bangladesh Meteorological Department, mild cold wave was swept over Khulna, Rangpur and Rajshahi divisions and the districts of Tangail, Faridpur Rangamati, Sitakunda, Chandpur, Kishoreganj, Madaripur, Bhola,

Mymensingh and Barisal containing average temperature 6.1-8.0°C. The severe cold (02-06°C) flow through

Sunamganj, Comilla, Chittagong and Noakhali regions including Mymensingh, Rangpur and Barisal divisions and Dhaka. Mild and moderate kind of cold wave triumphed over some parts of Khulna division. The country's lowest temperature in 50 years was 2.6 degrees Celsius in Panchagarh district in January 06, 2018 (Bangladesh Meteorological Department).

#### **GOB Responses in January 2018**

Response in cold wave: The Government distributed 932,460 pieces of blanket and 80,000 packets of dry food in 20 districts for cold wave affected poor people. As well, the Government allocated 335,144 blankets (Gaibandha - 61,495, Natore - 46,000 Bogra - 67,951, Dinajpur - 79,470, Thakurgaon - 39,177, Noagaon - 58,828, Jessore - 59,270, Rangpur - 59,714, Nilphamari - 46,937, Meherpur - 13,817, Rajshahi - 57,163, Jhenaidah - 36,095, Panchagarh - 33,685, Joypurhat - 29,986, Kushtia - 30,067, Kurigram - 62,055 Chuadanga - 22,913, Lalmonirhat - 36,921, Chapainawabganj - 37,457 and Pabna - 55,406). Also, 4,000 packets of dry food were allocated to each of the mentioned districts.

#### Conclusion

Disaster frequency was comparatively high in the month of January than previous month. In January, the long term cold wave situation shivered the country with historical lowest temperature of 2.6 degree Celsius. However, the Government undertook response interventions only for cold wave affected people.
