


# **Overview of Hazard Incidents in November 2020**

In November 2020, four devastating hazards took place across Bangladesh i.e. Covid-19 pandemic, fire, boat capsize and riverbank erosion.

In November 2020, Covid-19 affected a total of 57,238 persons across the country among which 721 persons died and 56,466 persons recovered. From March 08, 2020 to November 30, 2020, the total number of Covid-19 patient is 464,932 among which 6,644 persons died and 380,711 persons recovered.

27 incidents of fire took place which killed 5 persons and injured 36 persons. However NDRCC reported 521 incidents throughout the country in which Dhaka division faced 187 incidents and Chattogram division faced 84 incidents of fire in November 2020. Riverbank erosion happened over 2 districts with 2 incidents which eroded 50 houses, collapsed 2 embankments, flooded 5 villages and eroded 100 acre cropland.

Boat capsize took place in 2 districts with 2 incidents in which 1 person was killed.

# Description of Hazard Incidents in November 2020

### **Covid-19 Pandemic in Bangladesh**

The Covid-19 pandemic had affected with high impacts throughout this month in all the 64 districts across Bangladesh. In November, 2020, the number of identified patients with Covid-19 is 57,238 persons among which 56,466 persons recovered and 721 persons died. From the very first case identified in March 2020, the total number of Covid-19 patient is 464,932 among which 6,644 persons died and 380,711 persons recovered up to November 30, 2020. Though government has taken steps to minimize movement of people the situation may become worsen if health guidelines by the Director General of Health Services (DGHS) are not maintained properly.



# <u>Fire</u>

27 incidents of fire took place which killed 5 persons and injured 36 persons. However NDRCC reported 521 incidents throughout the country in which Dhaka division faced 187 incidents and Chattogram division faced 84 incidents of fire in November 2020. 200 houses and 35 shops were burnt in Sattala slum, Mohakhali under Dhaka district, on November 23.

### **Riverbank Erosion**

2 incidents of Riverbank Erosion took place in 2 districts, i.e. Feni and Patuakhali. In Fulgaji upazila under Feni district, 5 villages were flooded and 2 embankments in Muhuri and Kohua river were brokendown. In Baufol upazila under Patuakhali district 50 houses, 100 acre cropland, Eidgah field, Electric pole and different species of plants were eroded.

#### **Boat capsize**

Only 2 incidents happened in 2 districts, i.e. Noakhali and Sunamganj, in which 1 person killed in Hatia and 60 sacks of cement drowned in Dharampasha.

# **GoB Response in November 2020**

Response to Covid-19 up to November 30, 2020: The mass people have been guided to maintain social distance in workplaces, public transports, and religious institutions and avoid any kind of public gatherings. DGHS has prepared guidelines for the organizations (both public and private) to be maintained during working hours. DGHS and IEDCR have undertaken necessary steps to test Covid-19 suspected patients in the test labs across the country which have already tested 2,772,701 samples as of November 30, 2020. A total of 11,338 general beds, 566 Intensive care unit (ICU) beds, 13,663 Oxygen cylinders, 609 high flow nasal cannula, and 403 oxygen concentrator are available in the hospitals across the country. DGHS and IEDCR have opened up hotline number (i.e. 16263, 333, 10655, 01927711784, 01927711785, 01937000011, 01937110011) for consultation with doctors through phone calls which already have attended 22,965,856 phone calls. Screening have been conducted of 12,62,986 persons in airports, railway stations, sea port and land ports. People (especially poor and ultra-poor) who are in need of foods, GoB arranged to provide food at their doorsteps by the local administrations (*Source: DGHS Health Bulletin*, November 30, 2020).

**Response to Fire:** Government responded to two incidents of fire. 146 families received 30 kg rice each in Sattala slum, Mohakhali in 26 November. And each families of 97 houses received 30 kg rice by local authority in Mohammadpur johori Moholla in 24 November.

**Anticipatory response to Seasonal Impact:** Government Distributed 58,000 packets of dry and other foods to 58 upazilas of 8 districts, i.e Dinajpur, Kurigram, Rangpur, Gaibandha, Nilphamari, Lalmonirhat, Panchagarh and Thakurgaon.

#### Conclusion

A total of four hazards took place in this month with several incidents across the country. These incidents caused a huge loss of lives and properties and disrupted daily activities of people. GoB took initiatives to minimize the losses and also undertook necessary actions to provide support to the distressed people.
