




Overview of Hazard Incidences in January 2023

In January 2023, seven types of hazard incidents occurred across Bangladesh, including, Boat Capsized, Covid-19, Cold Wave, Dengue, Fire, Riverbank Erosion, and Wild Animal Attacks. With reference to the daily hazard situation report of MoDMR and DDM, a total of 1040 Fire incidents took place in 21 districts, resulting in the deaths of **nine** people and injuring **six** people. Also, several property damages were recorded such as 10 tin shed shops, 30 business institutions, a rickshaw garage, 5 houses, etc. were burnt due to Fire incidences in January 2023. The estimated losses were 150 crores and 91 lac taka. Six incidents of Boat Capsized occurred in 6 districts including Narail, Shariatpur, Chandpur, Kurigram, Barishal, and Netrokona districts. Due to these incidents, seven people died and four people were missing in the aforementioned districts. On the basis of the DGHS daily situation report, **Dengue** was less severe in January 2023 with compare to the month of December 2022. It caused the **death** of 6 people and 566 confirmed cases were identified throughout 38 districts in this month. Two events of the Wild Elephant Attacks happened in Kurigram and Bandarban districts respectively on the 10th and 25th of January 2023. In Bandarban, a farmer was killed by a Wild Elephant Attack. Besides, one event took place at Delduar upazila Tangail district on 24th January due to Crazy Buffalo Attack resulting in three people being killed and seven people being injured. Covid-19 affected a total number of 431 people in 27 districts in the month of January 2023. According to the national report published by DGHS in January 2023, due to Covid-19, only two people have died and 5,189 recovered. The devastating activity of Covid-19 was decreased with compare to the month of December 2022. In the districts of Jamalpur, Shariatpur, Rajshahi, and Sirajganj, five incidents of Riverbank Erosion occurred which resulted, in 988.406 acres of land had been lost due to erosion and 50 homesteads, Government primary schools, mosques, madrasas, markets, and large cropland were in danger. There were two Clod Wave events flown throughout 41 districts in January month. One was a mild Clod Wave which occurred in three districts on 2nd January and another was a mild to moderate Clod Wave blown through 38 districts from January 6 until January 23. The minimum temperature was recorded at 5.6 degrees Celsius at Sreemangol during cold wave situations on 20 January 2023. No casualties were recorded due to the Cold Wave situation.

Description of Hazard Incidents in January 2023


Boat Capsized

Six incidents of Boat Capsized happened five districts i.e. Narail, Shariatpur, Chandpur, Kurigram, Barishal, and Netrokona in several dates of January 2023. Due to Boat Capsized, **seven** people died and **four** people were missing in the aforementioned districts. In **Narail**, **four** people **died** on 1st January (<u>prothomalo</u>). After that incident, a young boy was missing in the Shariatpur district on 7th January (<u>prothomalo</u>). Besides, on 16th January two incidents occurred in Chandpur and Kurigram districts respectively. One child died and two people were missing in Chandpur (<u>prothomalo</u>) while in Kurigram one woman was missing (<u>samakal</u>.). On 30th January one person died in Barishal district (<u>bangla.bdnews24</u>). Lastly, in Netrokona a coal loader engine driver died on 31st January (<u>jagonews24</u>).

Covid-19


The number of newly identified patients with Covid-19 has 431 from 1st January to 31st January 2023. In this month 5,189 people have recovered, and the total death only two which indicates both the number of death and the confirmed cases have decreased compared to the month of December. The total number of confirmed cases has 2,037,556 from the first identification of Covid-19 in Bangladesh in March 2020. The total death and recovered to the end of January was 29,442 and



1,992,922 respectively DGHS. See Annex 2 for more details information.

Cold Wave

This month, there were two cold wave events, one mild and another mild to moderate, took place in 41 districts. One occurred on January 2nd, while the other ran from January 6 until January 23. The first one was a mild cold wave that occurred in three districts Panchagarh, Moulvibazar, and Kurigram, respectively while a mild to moderate clod wave was blown through 38 districts including Barishal, Bhola, Barguna, Bogura, Chuadanga Chapai-nawabganj, Cumilla,



Dinajpur, Faridpur, Feni, Gopalganj, Gaibandha, Jessore Jhalokati, Joypurhat Jamalpur, Kishoreganj, Khustia, Lalmonirhat, Madaripur, Manikganj, Mymensingh, Natore, Naogaon, Nilphamari, Netrokona, Pabna, Pirojpur, Patuakhali, Rangamati, Rajshahi, Rangpur, Saidpur, Shatkira, Sherpur, Sirajganj, Thakurgaon and Tangail. The minimum temperature was recorded at **5.6** degree Celsius at **Sreemangal** during cold wave situations, **20 January 2023**. DDM. The daily minimum temperature showed a positive trend in January with compare the December month. In December the trend of daily minimum temperature was negative. No casualties were recorded due to the cold wave situation in January month.

Dengue

On the basis of DGHS daily situation report, the confirmed cases and death both decreased in January month compare with December month. In January, just 38 districts suffered from dengue, and as usual, **Dhaka** has the highest confirmed cases (279) and deaths (3). Secondly, Chattogram district confirms cases (77) and deaths (3). In December where the number of confirmed cases was 5,233 while in January it went down to 566 and the death toll decreased from 27 to 6 people. See the details in Annex 3.

Fire

According to the <u>NDRCC</u> report and different dailies, **1040** fire incidents took place across the country in January 2023. Dhaka division reported the highest number of fire incidents (**226**), followed by Rangpur division (**191**), Rajshahi division (**145**), Khulna (**140**), Chattogram division (**112**), Mymensingh division, (**100**), Sylhet division (**80**) and Barishal division (**46**). Among the **1040** incidents, **nine** people **died**, **six** were **injured**, and several property damages were recorded such as shops, tin shed shops, business institutions, a rickshaw garage, family's houses, etc. The estimated losses were recorded as approximately **150 crores** and **91 lakh** taka. Riverbank Erosion

On the basis of different national dailies, Riverbank Erosion occurred in 4 districts namely Jamalpur, Shariatpur, Rajshahi, and Sirajganj on several dates in January month 2023. **988.406 acres** of land had been eroded due to riverbank erosion and **50** homesteads, Government primary schools, mosques, madrasas, markets, and large cropland are in danger. Wild Animal Attack

Three wild Animal Attack events took place in several dates in January month which resulted four deaths and seven injured. On 10th January a wild elephant attacked in Kurigram district Rajibpur upazila which resulted about 200 decimal maize crops and at least 50 decimal sorghum crops fields were destroyed in three villages (prothomalo.com). A Crazy Buffalo Attack took place at Delduar upazila of Tangail district on 24th January resulting in three people being killed and also seven people being injured (prothomalo.com). On the other hand, a wild elephant attack on 25th January near Bandarban district Naikhongchhari upazila resulted in the death of a farmer (bdnews24.com).

Conclusion

Total **seven** types **of** hazard took place in January 2023 with multiple casualties of life and assets across the country. These incidents caused a huge loss of lives and properties and disrupted daily activities.
