



Description of Hazard Incidents in August 2020

In August 2020, eleven devastating hazards took place across Bangladesh i.e. Covid-19 pandemic, flood, lightning, fire, boat capsizes, Riverbank erosion, wall Collapse, bridge collapse, wild animal attack, heavy rainfall and landslide.

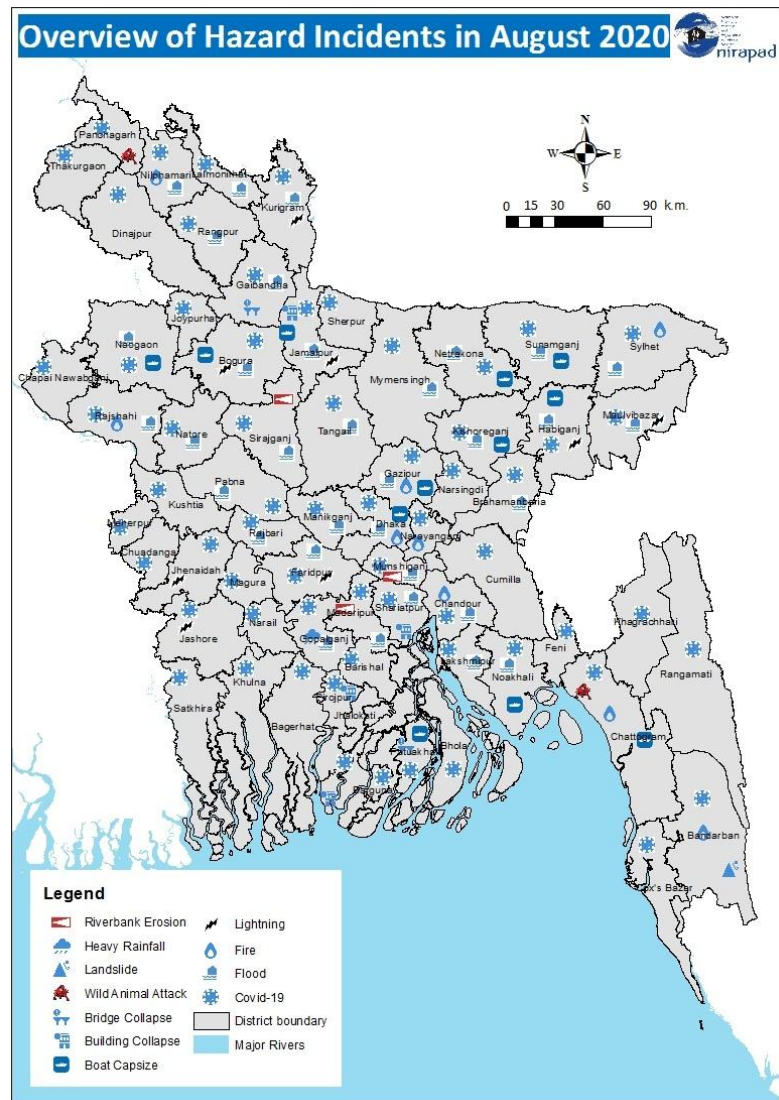
In August 2020, covid-19 affected a total of 74,957 persons across the country among which 1,170 persons died and 71,170 persons recovered. From March 08, 2020 to August 31, 2020, the total number of Covid-19 patient is 312,996 among which 4,281 persons died and 2,04,887 persons recovered.

According to *NDRCC report* of August 31, 2020, flood affected 5,563,777 persons in 33 districts across the country among which 44 persons died so far.

14 incidents of fire took place which killed 4 persons and injured 2 persons. However NDRCC reported 260 incidents throughout the country where Dhaka division faced 92 incidents and Chattogram division faced 36 incidents of fire in August 2020.

Lightning took place in 8 districts with 11 incidents in which 15 persons killed and 5 persons injured. Boat capsizes took place in 12 districts with 14 incidents in which 40 persons killed, 2 persons injured and 5 persons were missing along with drowning of 2 lighter ships. Riverbank erosion happened over 3 districts with 5 incidents which eroded 300 houses, collapsed 3 protection dam, damaged 8 educational and religious institutions.

4 incidents of wall collapse took place in 4 districts which killed 3 persons and injured 1 person. Only two incidents of bridge collapse took place in Potuakhali and Gaibandha in which total of 3 persons injured. 2 incidents of Wild Animal Attack happened in 2 districts which killed 2 persons. The only incident of Heavy Rainfall happened Gopalganj which damaged vegetable plants and caused a approximate loss of 1 crore BDT. One incident of landslide took place Bandarban where 1 person is injured and 1 person is missing.

Description of Hazard Incidents in August 2020

Covid-19 Pandemic in Bangladesh

The covid-19 pandemic had affected with high impacts throughout this month in all the 64 districts across Bangladesh. In August, 2020, the number of identified patients with Covid-19 is 74,957 persons among which 71,170 persons recovered and 1,170 persons died. From the very first case identified in March 2020, the total number of Covid-19 patient is 312,996 among which 4,281 persons died and 204,887 persons recovered up to August 31, 2020. Though government has taken steps to minimize movement of people but the situation may become worsen if health guidelines by the Director General of Health Services (DGHS) are not maintained properly.

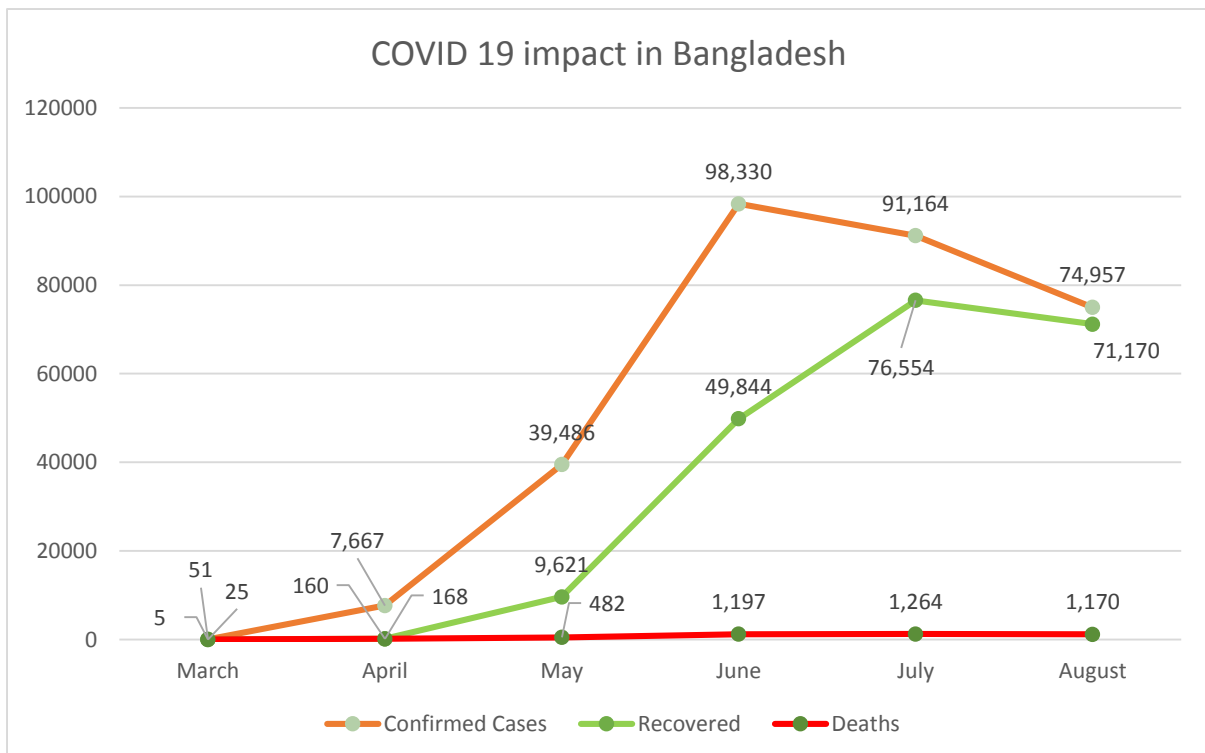

Monsoon Flood

Due to heavy rainfall and shower from the upstream a flood started to take place and as of NDRCC report on August 19, 2020, the flood impacted 33 districts i.e. Lalmonirhat, Kurigram, Gaibandha, Nilphamari, Rangpur, Sunamganj, Sirajganj, Bogura, Jamalpur, Sylhet, Tangail, Rajbari, Madaripur, Manikganj, Faridpur, Netrokona, Naogaon, Shariatpur, Dhaka, Munshiganj, Kishoreganj, Brahmanbaria, Chandpur, Noakhali, Lakshmipur, Natore, Habiganj, Mymensingh, Rajshahi, Moulvibazar, Gazipur, Gopalganj and Pabna in which 5,448,926 people affected in 1381 unions under 165 upazilas, 1,059,295 households became marooned and 44 persons died. Since 1998, this is going to be the most prolonged flood as per the forecast. Honorable Prime Minister, Sheikh Hasina said, “this year, floods may stay far longer”. Honorable Prime Minister also provided necessary instructions for the local leaders to support and to stand beside flood-affected people across the country. The impact of flood up to August 31, 2020 is given in the table below:

Fire

14 incidents of fire took place which killed 4 persons and injured 2 persons. However NDRCC reported 260 incidents throughout the country where Dhaka division faced 92 incidents and Chattogram division faced 36 incidents of fire in August 2020. In Pahartali thana under Chattogram district, on August 14, 2020, 2 persons were killed and 15 houses of a slum burnt.

Lightning

11 incidents of lightning took place in 8 districts i.e. Jashore, Kurigram, Jhenaidah, Moulvibazar, Bogra, Faridpur, Jamalpur and Habiganj in which 15 persons killed and 5 persons injured. In Lalmonirhat, on 20 August, 9 persons killed and two persons injured in 5 incidents in a single day.

Boat capsizing

14 incidents of boat capsizing took place in 12 districts, i.e. Habiganj, Dhaka, Kishoreganj, Jamalpur, Bogra, Netrakona, Sunamganj, Naogaon, Kuakata, Gazipur, Chattogram and Noakhali in which 40 persons killed, 2 persons injured and 5 persons were missing; 2 lighter ships drowned. In Modon upazila under Netrakona district, on August 5, 2020 an incident of boat capsizing took place where 18 persons were killed.

Riverbank Erosion

5 incidents of Riverbank Erosion took place in 3 districts, i.e. Sirajganj, Madaripur and Munshiganj in which 300 houses eroded, 3 protection dam collapsed, 8 educational and religious institutions damaged and 1 ferry terminal disappeared in the river. In Chauhali upazila under Sirajganj district, on August 1, 2020 a significant incident of riverbank erosion took place where 300 houses eroded; 7 educational and religious institutions damaged.

GoB Response in August 2020

Response to monsoon flood: GoB undertook necessary initiatives to minimize losses due to monsoon flood. A total of 19,510 MT GR rice, BDT 42,700,000 GR cash, 168,000 packets of dry foods, BDT 33,000,000 for cattle food, BDT 15,400,000 for baby food, BDT 900,000 for costs of shelter construction and 300 bundles tin have been already allocated for the flood affected districts. The district-wise allocation of relief by the Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief (MoDMR) is given below in the table:

Response to Covid-19 up to August 31, 2020: The mass people have been guided to maintain social distance in workplaces, public transports, and religious institutions and avoid any kind of public gatherings. DGHS has prepared guidelines for the organizations (both public and private) to be maintained during working hours. DGHS and IEDCR have undertaken necessary steps to test Covid-19 suspected patients in the test labs across the country which have already tested 15,50,203 samples as of August 31, 2020. A total of 14,843 general beds, 550 Intensive care unit (ICU) beds, 12,733 Oxygen cylinders, 438 high flow nasal cannula, and 178 oxygen concentrator are available in the hospitals across the country. DGHS and IEDCR have opened up hotline number (i.e. 16263, 333, 10655, 01927711784, 01927711785, 01937000011, 01937110011) for consultation with doctors through phone calls which already have attended to 19,736,159 phone calls. Screening have been conducted of 8,76,8400 persons in airports, railway stations, sea port and land ports. People (especially poor and ultra-poor) who are in need of foods, GoB arranged to provide food at their doorsteps by the local administrations (Source: DGHS Health Bulletin, August 31, 2020).

Conclusion

A total of eleven hazards took place in this month with several incidents across the country. These incidents caused a huge loss of lives and properties and disrupted daily activities of people. GoB took initiatives to minimize the losses and also undertook necessary actions to provide support to the distressed people.
