














































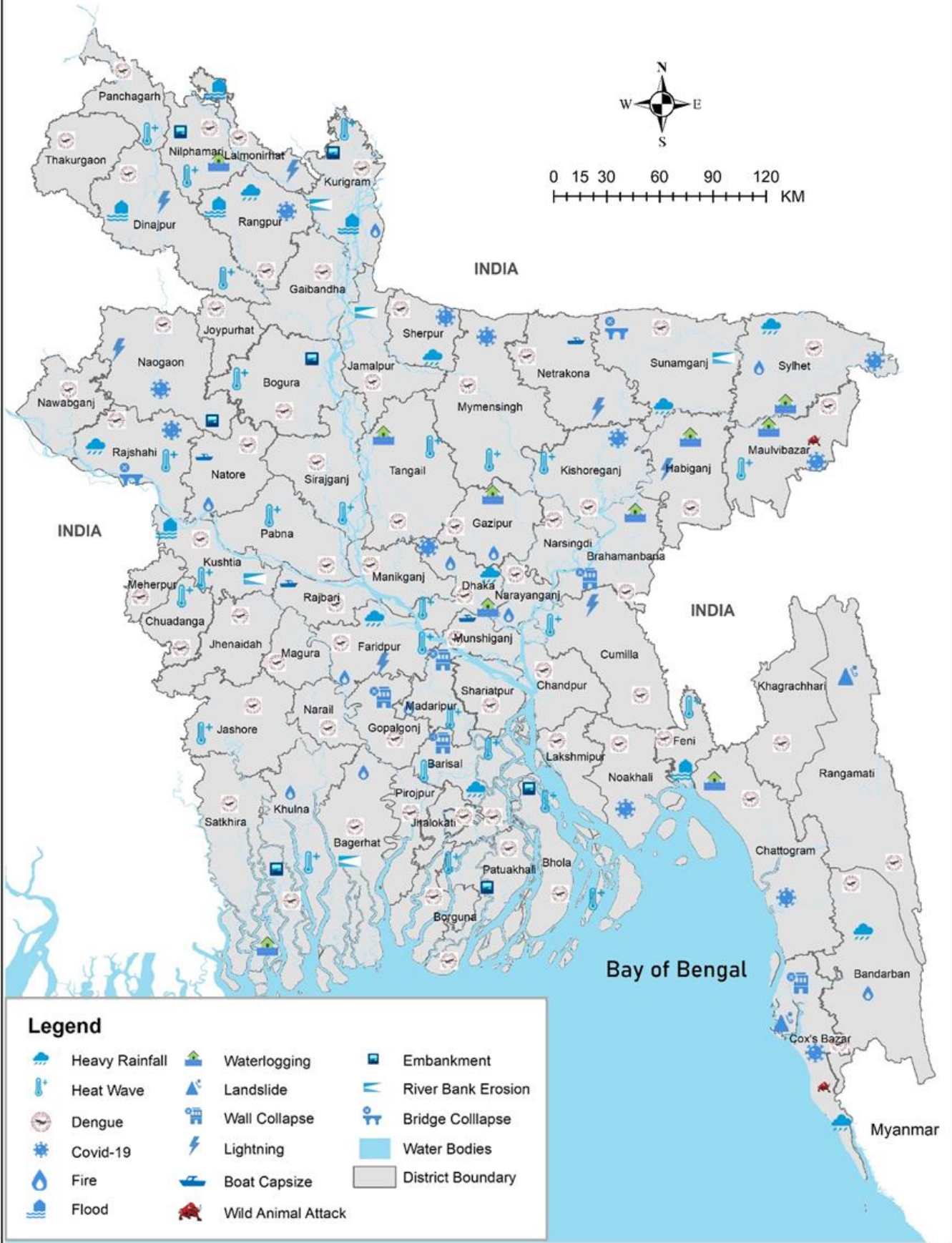
## Overview of Hazard Incidences in September 2023

In September 2023, Bangladesh encountered a total of **15** different hazard incidents which included **Boat Capsize, Bridge Collapse, COVID-19, Dengue, Embankment Collapse, Fire Incident, Flood, Heatwave, Heavy Rainfall, Landslide, Lightning, Riverbank Erosion, Wall Collapse, Water Logging and Wild Animal Attack**. Comparing September to August, there was a notable increase in the number of confirmed **dengue** cases and fatalities. The outbreak affected every district in Bangladesh, with **79,598** confirmed cases and **396** fatalities reported in September ([DGHS](#)). A total of **329** fire occurrences were reported, citing the daily hazard situation report from [MoDMR](#) (**310**) and the daily newspapers (**19**). Tragically, **12** people died and **28** people were injured as a result of these tragedies. In addition, **225** stores were damaged. The daily newspapers reported that **seven lightning** incidents were occurred, resulting in **nine** fatalities and **one** injury in several unions. **Four boat capsizes** incidents occurred in different districts, **four** people were killed and **one** person was missing.

**Waterlogging** was noted in three districts (Dhaka, Satkhira, Narsingdi) around the nation in the month of September. In Mirpur, electrocution on a flooded road resulted in **four** fatalities and **one** injury. In September, there were **397** new confirmed **COVID-19** cases recorded, along with **two** reported fatalities and **517** persons who were simultaneously recovering from the virus. **Two** fatalities and **three** injuries were reported for the **wall collapse** incident. **One wild animal attack** resulted in a fatality. In September, **nine** incidents of **embankment collapse** in seven areas were documented. The Sunamganj district experienced a **bridge collapse** incident. **Six riverbank erosion** occurrences were reported in Rangpur, Mymensingh, Sylhet, and Khulna. In Rangamati district, **one landslide** was recorded in September. On 23<sup>rd</sup> September, there was occurred a flash flood incident in the Dinajpur district. During this month, Bogura experienced maximum temperature of 38.4 degrees Celsius. Furthermore, Sunamganj encountered most significant daily rainfall of the month, reaching 193 mm daily rainfall on September 15th.

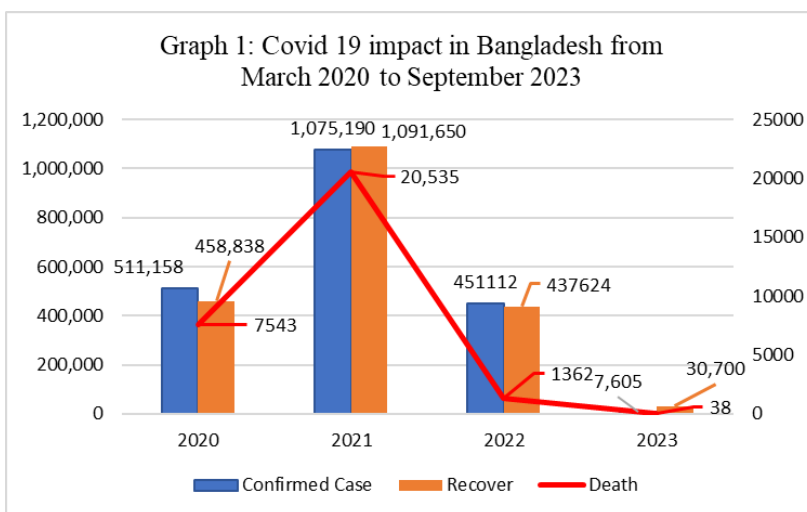
# Hazard Incidence in Bangladesh, September 2023



## Description of Hazard Incidences in September 2023

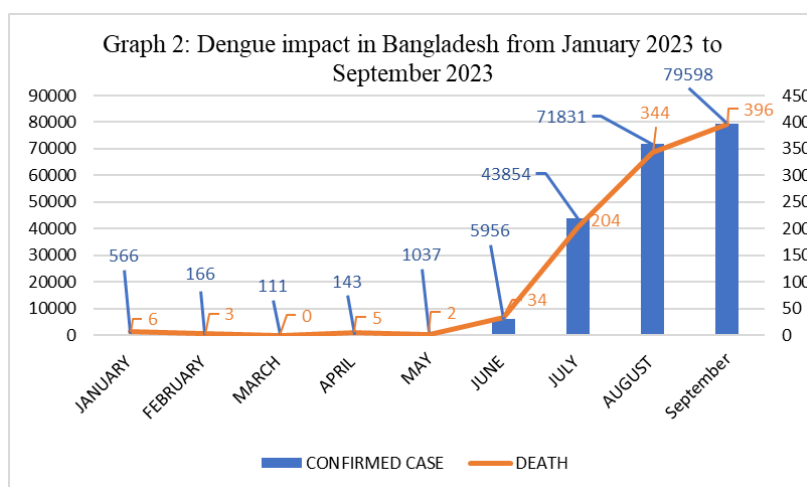
### Covid-19

In September there were **397** newly identified patients with COVID-19. During this period, **517** people have recovered and **2** reported deaths. As of the end of September, the total number of confirmed cases since the first identification of COVID-19 has reached **2045729**. The total number of deaths by the end of September was **29,477** and the total number of recovered cases was **13,352** in Bangladesh ([DGHS](#)). ### Dengue

Based on the [DGHS](#) daily situation report, there was an increase in confirmed cases and deaths of dengue compared to the previous month. In September, dengue cases have spreaded all over the country. Dhaka, recorded the highest number of confirmed cases (**25861**) and deaths (**201**). There were **79598** confirmed cases and **396** reported deaths in total throughout



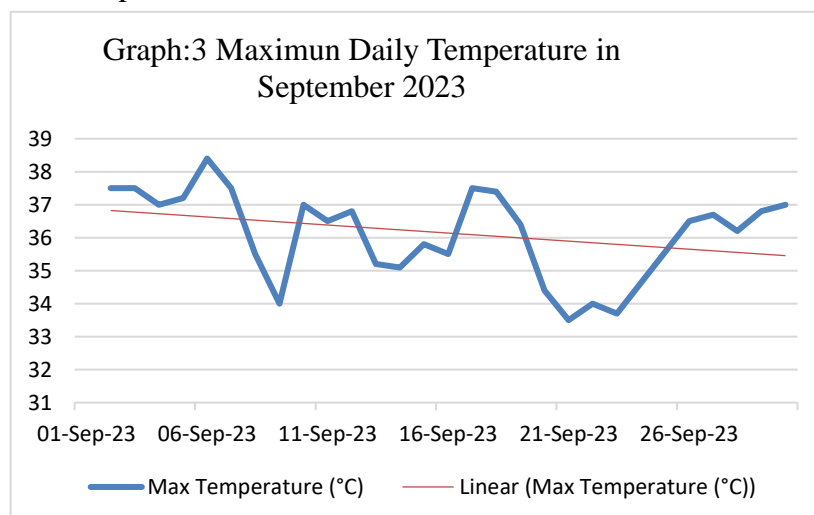
September. The graph shows the impact of dengue-confirmed cases in the month of September. For more information, please refer to [Annex-2](#).

### Embankment collapse

In September, nine incidents of embankment collapse occurred in Kurigram, Bogra, Nilphamari, Khulna, Bhola, Patuakhali, and Naogaon Districts. These incidents involved embankment collapses triggered by river erosion, breaches of dams, and flooding in vital areas like fishing grounds and villages. ### Heat Wave

According to the National Disaster Response Coordination Centre (NDRCC) in this month, there were **three mild Heat Wave** events occurred in September (2-7 September, 11-12 September, 17-18 September). 35 districts of eight division were impacted by the heat wave. Maximum temperature was recorded at **38.4** degrees Celsius



at Bogura 6<sup>th</sup> September. Heat wave days were identified using criteria from the Bangladesh Meteorological Department (BMD), categorizing mild heat waves when the maximum temperature ranged between 36-38°C ([BMD](#)) For detailed information, please refer to [Annex-4](#).

### **Fire**

According to the NDRCC daily hazard situation reports, **310** fire incidents took place across the country in September 2023. Dhaka division reported the highest number of fire incidents (**124**). **Eight** fatalities and one injury were reported, along with significant property damage. For detailed information, please refer to [Annex-5.1](#).

In September, a total of **19** fire incidents were reported in daily newspapers. On the first week of this month, **nine** fire incidences were occurred in seven districts (Dhaka, Sylhet, Bandarban, Madaripur, Faridpur, Cox's Bazar, Kurigram). Total **six** people were killed and **21** people were burnt in those incidences. And it's caused around a loss of two crore taka. In five districts, there were **six** fire accidents in the third week of this month and **three** in the fourth. **Six** people were killed and **seven** people were injured in fire incidences. Total **225 shops** were damaged. For detailed information, please refer to ([Annex-5.2](#)).

### **Heavy Rainfall**

The highest amount of rainfall was recorded in Moheshkhola of Sunamganj district in the month of September. The amount of rainfall was **193 mm**. Due to heavy rainfall the low-lying areas of the capital city accumulated knee-deep water.

### **Boat Capsize**

**A farmer** was reported missing in a boat capsized incident at Pangsha upazila of Rajbari district on 4<sup>th</sup> September. On 5<sup>th</sup> September, **one** man died after at Kalmakanda upazila of Netrakona district. **One** died after a boat capsized after being hit by a bulkhead in the Dhaleshwari river of Sirajdikhan upazila of Munshiganj district on 18<sup>th</sup> September. On the same day, **two** children were died at Naldanga upazila of Natore district. For detailed information, please refer to [Annex-6](#).

### **Bridge Collapse**

On 3<sup>rd</sup> September, there was erosion on both sides of the bridge in the Jamalganj upazila of the Sunamganj district ([ittfaq](#)).

### **Riverbank Erosion**

**Six** riverbank erosions occurred in the month of September. Erosion occurred at **20** places of Teesta River flowing through Rajarhat and Ulipur upazilas of Kurigram district on 6<sup>th</sup> September. On 15<sup>th</sup> September, severe erosion occurred in 9 villages in Bakshiganj upazila of Jamalpur district. People lost their homes at Char Rajibpur upazila of Kurigram district due to the erosion of the Brahmaputra River on 15<sup>th</sup> September. On 18<sup>th</sup> September, the people of more than half a hundred villages in this region are in fear as the main part of the road has been destroyed by the river erosion at Chhatak upazila of Sunamganj district. A school collapsed at Kumarkhali upazila of Kustia district on 21<sup>st</sup> September. For detailed information, please refer to [Annex-7](#).

### **Wild Animal Attack**

A 45-year-old man died after being attacked by an elephant in the Sagarnal union of Juri upazila of Moulvibazar district in Sylhet division on September 6, 2023 ([thedailystar](#)).

### **Waterlogging**

On 9<sup>th</sup> September 2023, waterlogging occurred on Thana Road in Raipura Municipality of Narsingdi District due to rain. The lower areas of Satkhira municipality and the vast townships of Sadar upazila in Satkhira district have been submerged in water due to continuous rains for several days on 9<sup>th</sup> September. On 22<sup>nd</sup> September, **four** people, including **three** from a family, were killed and **one** injured due to electrocution on a waterlogged road in Mirpur and at Shahbag, Dhaka

University's two halls were flooded due to continuous rain, and students were in trouble. For detailed information, please refer to [Annex-8](#).

### **Lightning**

A total of **seven** lightning incidents occurred at seven Union of seven districts (Faridpur, Cumilla, Netrokona, Habiganj, Naogaon, Dinajpur, Lalmonirhat) in the last week of September which led to the deaths of **nine** individuals and caused injuries to **four** others. ### **Landslide**

Due to heavy rainfall, a landslide occurred at Baghaichhari upazila in Rangamati district on September 19, 2023. It caused closure of the road link connecting the upazila to Sajek and the rest of the country ([dhakatribune](#)).

### **Flood**

The Meteorology department of Dinajpur recorded around 370 mm of rainfall and over 1,000 families were marooned. In this severe flood, several areas Hathatpara, Golapbagh, Lalbagh, Santinagar, Mazadanga, Ramnagar, Chawkchawka, areas surrounding Dinajpur Central Bus Terminal, and Maljhar village under Biral upazila were flooded on 23<sup>rd</sup> September ([thedailystar](#)).

### **Wall Collapse**

At Vijayanagar Upazila in Brahmanbaria district, **two** siblings died after the wall of their mud house collapsed due to rain, and three people were injured on 29<sup>th</sup> September ([prothomalo](#)).

## **Government of Bangladesh's Response**

### **Response to Fire**

Only 2 cases out of 19 fire incidences received responses from the governments. On 7<sup>th</sup> September, chairman of Rajivpur sadar union parishad helped the fire-affected families with Tk 10,000, 30 kg of rice, 2 kg of dal and 1 kg of sugar ([samakal](#)). On 14<sup>th</sup> September Dhaka district administration and DNCC opened a booth to list the businessmen and employees affected by the fire at Mohammadpur. The list will be sent to the Prime Minister's office for necessary cash or other assistance to victims ([prothomalo](#)).

### **Response to Lightning**

**Seven** lightning cases are found from newspaper. On 24<sup>th</sup> September, Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) at Chhirbandar Upazila of Dinajpur district provided one-time assistance of Tk 10,000 to the family of a lightning strike victim ([bd-pratidin](#)).

### **Response to Waterlogging**

There were occurred five waterlogging incidences. In 2 out of 5 places, the government took initiatives. On 9<sup>th</sup> September, the mayor of Raipura municipality of Narsingdi district has taken the initiative for water drainage system ([jugantor](#)). Satkhira Water Development Board-II has started digging rivers and canals to alleviate waterlogging. A quick completion of the work will provide a permanent solution to the waterlogging ([bd-protidin](#)).

## **Conclusion**

Bangladesh faced a total of 15 adverse weather events during September, with the highest impact on outbreak of dengue, fire incidents and heat waves. The fact that only three incidents of all received government response highlights the need to adopt a strong policy on disaster management in order to reduce the negative impact of natural disasters
